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Strength in Numbers

How dental networks empower practices amid CDCP challenges

he launch of the Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) has triggered a wave of uncertainty and apprehension among dentists and clinicians across Canada. Many practitioners, concerned about the program's impact and administrative complexities, have hesitated to enroll or start treating patients under the CDCP, which launched May 1. Recent figures indicate that only a fraction of oral healthcare providers have signed up so far*, reflecting widespread reservations within the profession.

Despite the initial challenges, there are signs of progress and adaptation within the CDCP framework. Notable developments, such as the option for oral health providers to direct bill Sun Life on a claim-by-claim basis starting July 8**, suggest a responsiveness to industry feedback and a willingness to evolve over time.

In this period of unprecedented change, Dentalcorp, Canada's largest network of dental clinics, has emerged as a key ally for its practices. Recognizing the need for support during the CDCP rollout, the DSO has recognized the value in proactively providing tools and assistance to ease the transition for enrolled dentists.

Julian Perez, Chief Legal and Compliance Officer at Dentalcorp, draws insightful parallels between the challenges of the COVID pandemic and the rollout of the Canadian Dental Care Plan.

"In times of disruption, such as the COVID-19 pandemic, and now with the Canadian Dental Care Plan, our scale, infrastructure, and dedicated support staff have been mobilized to the benefit of our clinicians," says Perez. 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Know Better - Do Better

A ground-breaking risk assessment strategy

he traditional approach to medicine has been predominantly reactive. Within this system, Dental Hygiene stands out as a true preventative healthcare model. I take pride in the proactive stance we, the dental hygienists, have adopted and the positive impact we have made on oral health and wellness. While we have made significant strides, I believe there is more work to be done.

Imagine being equipped with objective data that could predict the potential trajectory of your patient's oral health journey. How would this information influence your prevention strategies for them? The concept of personalized medicine, while not a diagnostic crystal ball, is unlocking a realm of possibilities by offering insights that were previously inaccessible in healthcare. This model evaluates an individual's genetic composition to gauge their level of risk for specific diseases and conditions. This concept is beginning to help us overcome the limitations of our more conventional risk assessment methods.

Within dentistry, a new dental product called Oral Risk, developed by the Canadian company AI Genetics, has introduced a salivary test to assess a patient's genetic predisposition to caries or periodontal disease. This innovative test utilizes a polygenetic risk score to illustrate an individual's susceptibility compared to the general population. The score is based on genetic variants, or markers, identified through genotyping and large Genome-Wide Association Studies. Currently, around 25 markers have been associated with periodontal disease and 36 to caries. Leveraging artificial intelligence (AI), geneticists can analyze this extensive genetic data to determine a person's baseline risk level as low, moderate, or high.

We are aware that periodontal disease and caries are affected by multiple factors beyond genetics, such as diet, lifestyle, oral hygiene practices, and conditions like diabetes. Unlike traits for eye colour or height, we can impact our genetic predisposition to these common diseases and do not need to feel like their occurrence is inevitable. While genes may set the foundation, lifestyle choices can either support or weaken it. This advanced tool and the insights it provides can serve to empower patients to proactively prevent these conditions.

Consider how this test could affect your dental hygiene appointments.

Enhanced Personalized Treatment Plans: This data can help choose the most customized treatment based on objective and individual risk levels, motivating patients to follow their prescribed plan.

Better Understanding of Risk: Genetic testing can offer insight into a patient's likelihood of developing periodontal disease or caries. This knowledge can inspire them to take preventive actions and adopt a proactive approach to their oral health, rather than just reacting to symptoms.

Empowerment Through Knowledge: Patients who grasp the genetic risk of their condition may feel empowered to make informed decisions regarding their oral health. This understanding can demystify their condition and alleviate any intimidation during the treatment process.

Improved Communication: Genetics can help explain the potential reasons behind a patient's symptoms or the ineffectiveness of past treatments. This can foster more productive conversations between patients and clinicians as they collaborate to determine the best course of action.

Increased Acceptance of Treatment Plans: When patients observe that their treatment plans are tailored to their unique genetic profile, they may cultivate a deeper trust in their oral healthcare provider's advice, resulting in improved compliance and outcomes.

The ability to evaluate a patient's genetic level of risk represents a new frontier in dentistry. Improved risk assessment, coupled with our extensive knowledge of prevention, has the potential to make the most significant impact on oral disease prevention to date. The adage "When we know better, we do better" is particularly relevant in this context.





LEASE AND VENDOR AGREEMENTS



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
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
